Prior to this bad news, in an interview with Locus magazine, Robert Jordan said the last of the main sequence books in *The Wheel of Time* series has a working title of *A Memory of Light*, and is shaping up to be a very long book. He has recently also committed to several other new books too.

Stanislaw Lem, Polish science fiction writer died on 27th March in Krakow at the age of 84. He wrote many novels (with millions of copies sold), notably *Solaris* which was twice made into a film. During his writing career, he has been the centre of several controversies, especially in conflict with American science fiction associations and reviewers. http://www.lem.pl/

David Feintuch died 16th March of a heart attack. His *Seafort* series has been popular amongst Infinitas readers, the first being *Midshipman's Hope*, space opera about a moralistic young naval officer. The logic used by characters in his stories hinted at Feintuch's legal background. Although he tried for many years to get a novel published, it did not happen until he was 50 years old, and then it was with great success, including winning the John W Campbell award.

Kurt Von Trojan, Vienna born Australian journalist and science fiction writer died last week after a short struggle with cancer. This news was shared around at Magic Casements.

A nasty cult on a crusade. Heroes and villains easily mistaken. A doomsday weapon unleashed. A good civilisation in retaliation, a bad civilisation needing to be rescued. An omnipotent sentient AI. An naïve but brave teenager. A cynical and justifiably paranoid journalist. A volunteer member of the unexploded bomb team. Competing black ops spy teams. What a recipe for a science fiction adventure.

This book started like a collection of short stories, but soon the threads weave together to create a gripping plot. This is hard science fiction with plot and character development. The science is believable while being far advanced from our own. The story is laced with humour and an inventive nastiness. Readers who enjoy Iain M Banks will also like this style.

This is the second novel in the Singularity Sky universe, but it is the first I read and it worked alone. Background and scene setting is well communicated early in the book. I will read more Stross. I have found a new favourite author.

Two Women of Galilee by Mary Rourke reviewed by Josephine Crowley

In this book we listen to Joanna, wife of Herod's steward Chuza, as she reflects back on sections of her life and her friendship with Mary mother of Jesus the Nazarene. Glimpses of daily life unfold in the court of Herod, plus the daily activities of ordinary people in the early days of Christianity. In her quest to be healed of an illness, Joanna becomes a follower of Jesus and in so doing meets Mary and becomes her friend.

The Jesus in this story remains a remote figure, but Mary Rourke has painted a picture of his mother as a warm, caring, loving woman.

Although there are quotations from scripture at the beginning of each chapter, this book is a novel and not meant to be an accurate account of the life of Mary as told in the gospels. But in saying that it is an advantage to be familiar with the gospel stories, otherwise some of the significance of this novel will be missed. Mary Rourke is to be congratulated for setting her novel at a time in history when women were not greatly acknowledged. It is an ancient tradition to create a fictitious life story of a minor character from the gospels. This book does reflect Christian values and follows the unfolding story of the gospels. The author has a through knowledge of the scriptures and has tried to bring to life the Mary of the gospels.

I did not enjoy this novel. I found the story disjointed and difficult to follow, somehow it lacked the substance and grit to make it an interesting read. I was really taken by the two medieval figures depicted on the front cover and looked forward to reading Two Women of Galilee, but it was really a very shallow story and disappointing.

Ian Graham's debut novel is basically a 568-page fight scene in which the pace rarely lets up. The story takes place in the land of Druine, where the oppressive Pilgrim Church holds sway. *Monument* features an unlikely protagonist in the form of one Anhaga Ballas, a 45-year-old drunken vagrant with a penchant for thievery and violence. When Ballas unwittingly murders one of the Church's supporters, a Decree of Annihilation is issued against him — any citizen of Druine who comes across Ballas is absolved in advance of sin, if they execute him. And so Ballas must try and flee the country, to the fabled, perhaps non-existent land of Belthirran, which lies beyond a treacherous mountain range. Meanwhile, Church Wardens, a magically gifted member of an insect-like race known as the Lectivins, and numerous young men eager to prove their fighting prowess, are all desperately trying to do away with him...While not for the squeamish, this book is nevertheless an exciting, action-packed read.

Author Interview

Interview with Peter Hamilton, author of JUDAS UNCHAINED

Q: How necessary is it for a science fiction writer to keep up with the latest theories and developments in physics and other sciences, and how do you approach this in your own work?

Peter Hamilton: It's very necessary. However, there are levels involved in just how much research I do on any given branch of science or engineering. A story requires a basic understanding of the technology involved in order to describe it convincingly. I'll find out what I can to avoid any fundamental mistakes or inaccuracies, but beyond that I simply avoid going into any detail. Given the rate of technological progress, details can become out of date very rapidly.

Q: Here in the United States, we are seeing a strong attempt by conservative political forces, often acting at the behest of religious fundamentalists, to censor scientific inquiry and the reporting of data determined to be at odds with political or religious dogma. Is this a purely American phenomenon, or have you noticed it in England as well? How much of a threat is this, really, and what do you think can be done about it?

PH: It's not so noticeable in England. Of course, given that the majority of scientific funding comes from government, it is depressingly inevitable that a political agenda will creep in. Given an environment of free speech, then pressure can always be brought upon institutes and universities to maintain an honest, balanced outlook.

Q: I'm intrigued by the title of your new novel, Judas Unchained. The previous novel in the series, Pandora's Star, alluded clearly to the eponymous Greek myth, but the new title mixes at least two allusions, which seem at first glance to be somewhat contradictory. First and most obviously, there is the reference to Judas set free, presumably from Hell, but there is also an echo of Prometheus Unbound, the title of plays by, respectively, Aeschylus and Shelley. It seems jarring to conflate Judas, regarded as a betrayer, with Prometheus, viewed as the benefactor of humanity. Can you shed some light on this, and on the novel itself?

PH: I think you're reading slightly too much into this! I'd never considered a connection between Unchained and Unbound. A working title was Judas Unleashed. It basically alludes to a traitor being let loose to do his worst, which is what book two of the series concerns itself with.

Q: The number of characters and sub-plots stretching across both books is dizzying and dazzling. How do you keep them all straight while you're writing?

PH: Simple answer: with difficulty! I do take several months to write notes on various worlds and characters, and work out plot lines before I even start writing. Once that's been done, and I have the major events sorted out, I'll start combining them into chapter outlines. Even these aren't fixed in stone; all it means is that I know where characters start a chapter and where they have to be when it finishes. What happens between is a combination of any ideas I come up with as I'm writing and the broad guidelines set out by the notes.
